7. If your previous degree was undertaken in a language other than English, you must demonstrate that you have obtained one of the levels of **English Proficiency** as noted in Section 5 of the application form. Failure to comply or complete the form this will jeopardise your application.

8. Please note that the School does not offer bursaries for the Masters or Doctoral degrees. However, Students undertaking full-time research Masters and research Doctoral Studies are exempted from paying tuition fees. Students are eligible for this remission of tuition fees if studies are completed in the minimum prescribed period of study (three years for a PhD, one year for a Masters). *Fulltime international students will be required to pay an international levy of R1 480 per semester (as per 2017).*

The Theology and Development Programme is an exciting and innovative postgraduate programme that interacts /links up with h clergy and laity in helping to shape a theologically informed and appropriate response to matters of social justice and poverty on our continent. We have large numbers of students and the demand for participation is high.

Acceptance into the PhD programme is dependent on:

- meeting the academic requirements of the University of KwaZulu-Natal.
- demonstrating academic competence.
- an available supervisor with adequate time and competence to supervise the area of research of the applicant.

All applicants for the PhD in Theology and Development are required to answer the following questions, with typed answers on a separate sheet.

1. What previous studies have you undertaken, and how has this shaped your views on development and social transformation? (500 words)
2. What experience have you had in development, and why do you feel that further studies will improve /increase/augment your ability to engage in social transformation? (500 words)
3. Detail/provide the key theological influences in your life and show how these relate to your interest in development. (1000 words)
4. Identify two scholarly studies /academic works which you have read in the last six months which have influenced your decision to apply for doctoral studies. Outline the critical arguments of each work/study and suggest how they have influenced your thinking. (1000 words)
5. What is your area of research interest and how do you propose to deal with the theme in your thesis? (1500 words)

6. What financial resources have you secured to undertake doctoral studies at the University of KwaZulu-Natal?¹
7. Are you intending to enter the doctoral programme as a full-time student resident in Pietermaritzburg? If not, how much time will you be able to spend in Pietermaritzburg during the course of your doctoral studies? Clearly outline your plans.
