Students are eligible for this remission of tuition fees if studies are completed in the minimum prescribed period of study (three years for a PhD, one year for a Masters).

7. Please ensure that you have completed all the necessary forms and attached all the necessary documents that are required by the University of KwaZulu-Natal, including the **motivational letter** referred to in 4 above.

8. If your previous degree was undertaken in a language other than English, you must demonstrate that you have obtained one of the levels of **English Proficiency** as noted in section 5 of the application form. Failure to complete this will jeopardise your application.

APPLICATION FOR PhD IN THEOLOGY AND DEVELOPMENT

The Theology and Development Programme is an exciting and innovative post graduate programme that works with clergy and laity in helping shape a theologically informed and appropriate response to matters of social justice and poverty in our continent. We have large numbers of students, and the demand for participation is very high.

Acceptance into the PhD programme is dependent on:

- meeting the academic requirements of the University of KwaZulu-Natal
- demonstrating academic competence
- an available supervisor with adequate time and competence to supervise the area of research of the applicant

All applicants for the PhD in Theology and Development are required to answer the following questions, with typed answers on a separate sheet.

1. What previous studies have you undertaken, and how has this shaped your thinking about development and social transformation? (500 words)
2. What experience have you had in development, and why do you feel that further studies will help your capacity to engage in social transformation? (500 words)
3. What have been the key theological influences in your life and how do they relate to your interest in development? (1000 words)
4. Identify two academic books which you have read in the last 6 months that have influenced your decision to apply to do doctoral studies. Outline the critical arguments of each book and suggest how they have influenced your thinking. (1000 words)
5. What is your area of research interest and how do you propose to deal with the theme in your thesis? (1500 words)
6. What financial resources have you secured to undertake doctoral studies at the University of KwaZulu-Natal?¹

¹ Please note that the School of Religion, Philosophy and Classics does not offer PhD scholarships. However, if you are a full time student, the University will grant you remission of tuition fees provided you complete your degree in three years. Funds for costs of accommodation, living expenses, books, travel etc need to be raised before you arrive in Pietermaritzburg.

7. Are you intending to enter the doctoral programme as a full-time student resident in Pietermaritzburg? If not, how much time are you able to spend in Pietermaritzburg during the course of your doctoral studies? Please outline your plans.
